Ibero-American Summits of Heads of State and Government

The Ibero-American Summit is the sole official space for convergence, work, monitoring and agreement in Ibero-America that brings together countries on both sides of the Atlantic. The 22 Heads of State and Government of Spanish- and Portuguese-speaking countries in Europe and the Americas meet every two years.

This meeting at the highest political level is characterized by a common desire to meet the global challenges through dialogue, cooperation and solidarity.

La Antigua Guatemala will be the host city of the XXVI Ibero-American Summit of Heads of State and Government in 2018.

Guatemala will coordinate, along with the Ibero-American General Secretariat (SEGIB), all meetings, forums and gatherings of the Conference and will promote activities related to the Ibero-American cooperation projects and programs.

HIGHLIGHTS

- These Summits are spaces for political dialogue at the highest level between the Heads of State and Government of the 22 Ibero-American countries.
- They were first organized in 1991, and have been held annually, without interruption, over the last 25 years. Since 2014, it is held on a biennial basis.
- The mandates adopted at the Summits are translated into Ibero-American Cooperation programs, initiatives and projects.
